### Food for Thought

Young people can also be negatively impacted by what they see. We know this from international studies, our own research, and from talking directly to parents and teenagers nationwide. Young people are looking for guidance – we know because they've told us so. We also know that parents and caregivers are concerned about what young people are viewing in movies, TV shows, games and websites.

1. Share and talk about entertainment media with your teen
2. Encourage them to think critically about what they view
3. Talk about sensitive or complex issues
4. Support your teen if they're distressed by something they've watched

You can't control everything young people see, but you can build their confidence by giving them tools to help deal with challenging media.
